

CONGRATULATIONS ON THE 30TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE HALL OF FAME



Larry Gill (Laurence Presley Gill) born 5/17/35 and raised in West Seattle, graduated from West Seattle High School in 1954. Earned BA in Business Administration & Economics from University of Puget Sound (1960), Doctor of Jurisprudence from Gonzaga Law School (1964) and Fellow of the Institute for Court Management's Court Executive Training program (1977).

He received awards and commendations from the Chief Justice and Associate Justices of each of the following courts: the Supreme

Chief Deputy Clerk - United States Supreme Court

Court of the United States, the Supreme Courts of Washington and California, and the Court of Appeals, Div. II of Washington State, for modernizing operations, and administration.

He was the Chief Clerk of the Supreme Court of California. He was selected from a National Search of 300 applications. As Chief Clerk, he represented the California Supreme Court and the State Bar of California. His signature on the Certificate of Admission to the Bar of each new attorney authorized that attorney to practice law in the State of California.

At the Supreme Court of the United States, he was the Chief Deputy Clerk, assigned as Operations Officer of the Clerk's Office, responsible for managing the entire staff and 10,000 cases per year. He worked closely with Chief Justice Warren Burger to design & implement the first computerized Appellate Court Case management system in the US. Other responsibilities included International Visitors such as the Lord Chief Justices of Great Britain and Chief Justice of Russia.

In his second career as one of seventeen planners creating a new National Park for the National Park Service, the Presidio of San Francisco. He was selected to work directly with U.S. Representative Nancy Pelosi (fn 1) and the British equal to our Secretary of Interior.

His Professional history: Chief Deputy Clerk, Washington State Supreme Court (1965), Law Clerk to Justice Frank Hale (1966); System's Analyst & Trust Administrator, Peoples National Bank of Washington (1967-9); Chief Clerk of Court, Washington Court of Appeals, Div. II (1969-74); Chief Deputy Clerk, U.S. Supreme Court (1974-80); Chief Clerk of Court, Supreme Court of California (1980-88). Planner, National Park Service (1990-2000).

Lastly, of special note, Mr. Gill's contributions to the U.S. Supreme Court as expressed by Chief Justice Warren Burger are of "lasting benefit to the Court" for which he expressed his "deep appreciation for the excellent work ...accomplished in the Clerk's Office". Earlier, Chief Judge Vern Pearson of the Washington State Court of Appeals,(fn 2) described Mr. Gill's service to that court as "invaluable".

ANNUAL ALL SCHOOL REUNION

Our Annual All School Reunion is something that is unique to the WSHS Nation. Something to keep us all connected on a very personal level for we all have our own reasons to join our fellow Alumni once every June.

Last year was the first time we all met on Saturday instead of Friday. It was not without some bugs.

A survey was emailed to a random 1,000 Alumni via an online survey and sent out to all members in the recent Holiday Mailer. Received were several hundred responses. Lessons were learned and adjustments made as we go. From your input changes are and will be made to accommodate the majority. A Saturday ASR with a later start and end time, favored by a majority, will begin NEXT YEAR with the 2017 ASR. THE 2016 ALL SCHOOL REUNION WILL BE HELD ON SATURDAY JUNE 4TH FROM 2:00 PM TO 5:30 PM.

The Class of 1966, which will have their 50th Reunion this year, pointed out they already have a website built and contracts executed for their reunion based on last year's afternoon schedule. This is one of the lessons learned from last year thanks to the vocal, yet very welcomed, feedback from the Class of 1965.

One of the more surprising revelations is that some 40% of respondents were not aware of dues. These dues are what keeps your Alumni Association going. The WSHS Alumni Association is run by volunteers. The dues, which are a nominal \$10 per year, provide the funds to publish and mail out 17,000 Chinooks, the maintenance of our Alumni website, and the cost to put on the Annual All School Reunion to name a few. BTW, if you are not getting your Chinook please email us with your contact information.

There were suggestions from the survey to make the sign in process better because of the long lines at the entrances. This was unacceptable to all. This year we will be going back to the time tested way of having the sign in sheets and collecting the dues in the classrooms. One of the reasons for the change last year was to get more sign in sheets and donations collected. PLEASE, class reps or someone from your class, REMEMBER to pick up your class envelopes prior to going up to your individual class reunions. Afterwards please make a special note to drop them off prior to leaving. It is important to have a good "head count" of the number of attendees from each year to know how to assign the rooms for the next ASR.

A favorite response to the survey question "What would you like to see improved/changed for next year's All School Reunion?". Simply "make us all look younger".

The WSHS Foundation is a non-profit organization and compliments the other groups who raise money for WSHS. In the past, The Foundation has donated funds to purchase musical instruments including twenty guitars, a xylophone and bassoon for the marching band, Smart boards (interactive technology) for several classrooms, library books, choir robes, bricks for the Courtyard, equipment for the athletic teams, a multimedia projector for the Performing Arts Center, original art work for the school building.

Most recently the Foundation helped purchase hand held calculators for the Math classrooms which was one

of funding requests from the November 2015 school Auction. Between the Foundation and another donor, we were able to purchase three sets of calculators (one set equals ten calculators) for a total of \$6600. These are required to be used with the math program the Seattle School District adopted.

We continue to be the recipient and conduit of an annual donation of \$10,000 a year for the purpose of hiring math tutors for the tutoring program at WSHS. This donor also donated funds to buy two sets of calculators for the Math program. The reports we receive from the school has shown that students are benefiting greatly from this additional help and math scores are rising.

The Foundation is interested in finding a few good people to join our group and help move our non-profit forward. Our goal is to continue the work of finding funding to support the needs of our students and staff. Some of our Board members have had changes in their personal lives and we need to train and pass on some of the jobs to continue the good work of this group. APBA Honor Squadron Award for West Seattle Grad

Don Kelson Awarded Highest Honor

While cruising my friend's Facebook postings this past week, I came across references to the American Power Boat Association annual meeting that took place in Chicago the weekend of January 23rd and the induction of the latest member of the APBA Honor Squadron.

The name of the 2016 inductee immediately caught my eye. Hey, I actually knew the man...Mr. Don Kelson of Seattle, WSHS Class of 1950. As usual, this set off the research bug in me, and I set about to find out more about the honor and the man who had received it.

The Honor Squadron of the American Power Boat Association is recognized as the highest of APBA's award programs. To make it into the Honor Squadron, a nominee for the award must meet one or more of the criteria set by the special committee. Above all, they must have engaged in extensive service to APBA and have made notable contributions to the APBA program and powerboat racing through race promotion (arranging new race sites and sponsors), structural improvements to the organization, functional improvements (rule restructuring, recruitment of drivers and officials, and committee involvement), major technological improvements to one or more aspects of the sport, and/or exceptionally long-term racing accomplishments.

To commemorate the induction, inductees receive certificates and medals that are presented at the Association's Annual Meeting that this year was held in Chicago.

After defining just what the award was, I set my sights on finding out more about the inductee Don Kelson. He was far from unknown to me because of my friendship with Bob Bolam and Don's son Jerry, and I had met and visited with Don several times over the past few years. But I had no idea about the depth of his involvement in the history of the sport of boat racing and his myriad contributions until I settled in to undertake my research.

I found that Don's involvement in the history of hydroplanes dates back to at least 1956. It was that year that one of Don's friends, Ray Hasselberg, asked him to build a race boat for him. Using a set of 280-class Norm Christianson plans, he constructed hat became the E-6 Miss B Haven for Hasselberg, a limited hydro that Don has described as both overweight and underpowered, and because of those handicaps it had limited success. In his second attempt, Don used a set of Colcock plans, building another 280-class hydro that became "What's New", a hull that enjoyed a bit more success. This led to collaboration with designer/builder Jack Colcock whereby Don took care of Colcock's overload of requests for new hulls and built several new boats. Having learned from the process, Don

tried some modifications to the basic designs that he had been working with and came up with his own design for a 225-class boat with canted air traps and dropped sponsons. The new design met with success and several were sold in Region 10 around Seattle.

About the same time that he started to build hydros, he also became active in the repair side of things. He was kept quite busy fixing damage to existing hulls, but it was now a sideline to the new business that he was establishing, one that expanded on hs woodworking and patterning skills. În 1964, he opened Modern Pattern Works on S. Austin Street in south Seattle. The business fabricates metal and wooden items that include everything from he patterns for railway switches to patterns for that make up massive pieces of equipment used in all aspects of local industry – from fishing boats to factories. Don's involvement with the Unlimiteds began to show up in the early 70's when Tony Mulherin moved in across the street from Modern Pattern Works and established a boat shop for his Hallmark Homes unlimited, formerly the '67 Miss Bardahl. That boat was reportedly brought to the Kelson shop for repairs and when it was destroyed in Madison, Indiana, Mulherin hired Kelson and his team to build a replacement hull. Joining with designer Ed Karelson, the two designed and built the new hull in Kelson's shop. It took Don and his team of builders headed by Hallmark Crew Chief Fred Wright, Bob Winter, and Ed Kelson three weeks to the day to build that boat and the record shows that the new hull raced the Sunday after it was completed, racing as Miss Van's P-X. The record also shows that the shiny new hull was launched and christened by Don's lovely wife, Annette Kelson, approximately 1.5 hours before the closure of the racecourse. The boat qualified the next day at a speed of 102.370. With Leif Borgerson driving, it went on to place third overall, with two third place finishes in the prelims and a third place in the final.

As a boat racer, Don had an extremely close call in mid-April of 1977 while racing at the Haag Lake Regatta near Forest Grove, Oregon. He was driving the Copy Cat 7-Litre when it spun out in a corner. Unable to avoid a collision with the suddenly stalled Copy Cat, Jerry Bangs was forced to drive his Champagne Lady over the top of the stricken boat. The propeller on Bang's boat cut Don's life preserver as he flew across the cowling, and Kelson was unable to free himself from the wreckage of the sinking hydro. Two other drivers (not identified in the media report) on the scene saw his predicament and worked to free him before the boat sank. Don was taken to a Portland hospital where he was initially listed as being in fair condition with a broken collarbone along with chin, neck, and chest injuries.

Three months later, Don had recovered enough to be photographed by the Seattle Times making repairs to Bernie Little's Natural Light unlimited.

If I have the story correct, Bill Sterrett, Sr. had borrowed that hull to take his wife Janet for a ride after the Kentucky Governor's Cup in Owensboro. It is said that he became distracted and accidentally ran the hull onto the shore causing extensive damage. Little towed the boat back to Seattle and it made its way to Modern Pattern Works, and the photo documents that Don was back on the job crafting the needed repairs.

Less than a month later Don made the news again, when, with a crew of ten and Little's entire Miss Budweiser unlimited crew, he worked around the clock to repair damage to the U-12, this time after it threw a propeller during testing for the Gold Cup n the Tri-Cities. The Bud team had immediately transported the boat back to Seattle and on to Kelson's Modern Pattern Works shop. The thrown prop and attendant vibration had torn apart the bottom of the boat while also causing severe damage to the boat's main stringer. Not only did Kelson and the emergency repair crew make the necessary repairs, but the boat was declared structurally stronger (by Don himself in one media report) after the repairs had been completed than it had been before the ac-

The Bud returned to the Tri-Cities in time to compete, and despite looking a bit worse for wear sans the boat's signature paint job, it placed second to Bill Muncey and Atlas Van Lines at that race. The Bud recorded two second place finishes and two first that day, punctuated by a hot-lap of 116.883 mph. There is evidence that Don also helped develop new drivers to the sport. In 1981, the Seattle Times mentioned that Don had been hired by Seattle radio executive and hydro owner (of Miss KYYX) Pat O'Day to mentor his new driver, Brenda Armstrong. The report revealed that Kelson was to coach her development in driving limited hydros in conjunction with the unlimited mentor that O'Day had hired to assist her -- Chip Hanauer -- who was then driving the Squire Shop.

On the boat building side of things, Don compared notes with unlimited designer and crew chief Jim Lucero, and perfected a cab over design. I am guessing that it is the design that has become more or less Kelson's trademark in several hydro classes. Over the years, his wood crafting and boat building protégés have included the likes of John Walters, Jeff Richards, Mike Hanson, and others who have proven to be good craftsmen in their own right. During that time, his shop had seen in excess of 50 hulls constructed within its walls, and according to one source, the Kelson team has modified, repaired, or recreated nearly twice that number. Over the years, Don's boats have developed a fine history of record setting and accomplishment. His 7-litre Copy Cat held the 1-2/3 mile record in 1976 and his Pussy Cat 7-Litre hull was the first such boat to average over 100 mph in competition, setting class record of 103.448 mph for three laps on

Green Lake, eclipsing the old record by more than two miles and hour. There are several mentions in the archives of the Seattle Times of Don and son Ed driving Rocket and Rocket III to wins in numerous local inboard races, and his sons Ed and Jerry reportedly won nationals and national high point championships with his designs. The record book is also jam-packed with champions in a broad number of classes that were designed and/or built by Don Kelson over the years, including my friend Bob Bolam's N-22 Bolam's Express. Rebuilds and recreations that he has supervised include that of Kirk Roger's Miss Merion Bluegrass, Calypso I, Wee Wahoo, and the Miss Vitamilk.

When the modern era of composite hulls and capsules for the Unlimiteds came in, Don's involvement and briefly faded, but as the vintage era has taken hold, he has become involved once again as I personally witnessed when I toured his shop two years ago. At the time of a visit by my brother and myself to the shop, Don was recreating the design for a J-Class outboard hydro from memory for his grandson, making sketches on a piece of scratch paper to help resolve design issues. Elsewhere in the shop were several re-build and re-creation projects like the Wee Wahoo. Don has also done his part to keep the boat building craft alive and to introduce new drivers to the sport as well. In recent years he has joined with Ed Karelson to design the J Hydros central to the Seattle Outboard Associations youth

racing development program. When the Hydroplane and Raceboat Museum shop was unavailable to host the boat building, Don provided his boat shop facility to be used or the project. Don has served in official capacities in the Region 10 hydro racing and has been inboard commissioner, a Com-

modore for the Seattle Inboard Racing Association,

and a technical and safety inspector. Watching them at the tribute given to Don at Soap Lake in 2014, it was easy to see what a wonderful family he and Annette have raised and the high esteem that the racing community has for Don himself. Being a small part of the tribute to him that day is stored away as one of my treasured memories from being involved in the sport of hydroplane

And so...I send heartfelt congratulations to Don for his recognition as a member of the APBA Honor Squadron. I also wish to pass along a hearty "Well to him in recognition of the tremendous leg acy that he has left the sport through his hard work and volunteerism.

For a building to qualify as a city landmark, the Seattle Landmarks Preservation Board must determine that it meets at least one of six criteria related to its association with a historical person or event, architectural style, designer or cultural heritage or status as an "easily identifiable visual feature" of its community. Based on the survey results, the historical society believes that both the Campbell Building and Hamm Building meet three or four of the criteria. In addition, the survey indicates widespread public support for preserving the buildings.

The historical society applied Feb. 24, 2016, for a 4Culture grant for funds to support preparation of landmark nominations for the two buildings. The process of nominating and designating the Campbell Building and the Hamm Building as landmarks is expected to run through summer and fall 2016. The historical society is in communication with representatives of the owners of the Campbell Building and the Hamm Building and will seek their support every step of the way.

Landmarking would protect certain historical elements of the two buildings but also would allow for routine maintenance and provide the owners with property-tax valuation breaks, zoning-code relief and eligibility for renovation grants.

The Campbell Building, home of Cupcake Royale, may be best known for its previous main tenant, LaGrace Fashion Apparel. The Hamm Building, home to Easy Street Records for the past 28 years, previously had People's Drug Store as its main tenant.

In line with the landmark campaign, the theme of the historical society's 2016 Champagne Gala – set for 11 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 5, 2016, at Salty's on Alki – is "Loving Our Landmarks."

This is not the historical society's first landmark campaign. The organization secured landmark status in 1989 for the Admiral Theater, which was first built in 1919 as the Portola Theater and expanded to become the Admiral Theater in 1942. In 1996, the historical society secured landmark status for Fir Lodge/Alki Homestead and its carriage house, now the "Birthplace of Seattle" Log House Museum (both built in 1904).

The Admiral Theater and the Alki Homestead this year are undergoing extensive restoration and renovation.

The "We Love The Junction" Task Force seeks volunteers and financial contributions as well as the support of other community organizations for the landmark campaign.



Junction landmark campaign under way!

Historical society seeks to preserve West Seattle Junction icons: the Campbell Building (1918) and the Hamm Building (1924)

Two buildings at the heart of the West Seattle Junction – and familiar to West Seattle High School graduates of any era – are the focus of a landmark campaign launched this year by the Southwest Seattle Historical Society.

Supported by a unanimous vote of its Board of Trustees, the historical society announced on March 5, 2016, its plan to nominate the Campbell Building (built in 1918, main tenant Cupcake Royale) and the Hamm Building (built in 1926, main tenant Easy Street Records) for designation as city landmarks by the Seattle Landmarks Preservation Board.

To support the landmark effort, the historical society has formed a "We Love The Junction" Task Force, which

is leading a multi-faceted publicawareness campaign.

The task force is organizing sales of "We Love The Junction" buttons (in two diameters: 1-inch and 2-1/4-inch, both \$1) as well as community educational sessions about the landmark campaign and the history of the West Seattle Junction.

West Seattle's main business district got its name immediately prior to the peninsula's annexation to Seattle in 1907, when the West Seattle and Fauntleroy streetcar lines converged at a transfer point at California Avenue and Alaska Street, forming "The Junction."

The Junction landmark effort springs from a 104-page document called the West Seattle Junction Historical Survey, whose results were released on March 2, 2016. The survey report has three parts:

- An assessment by an architectural historian of the landmark potential of 58 Junction buildings built in 1975 or
- · A collection of nine in-depth interviews of Junction building owners.
- The answers of 265 people who took part in a public Junction survey in 2015.

The survey – sponsored by the Southwest Seattle Historical Society, the Southwest District Council, the

West Seattle Junction Association, the Junction Neighborhood Organization and ArtsWest – placed the Campbell Building and the Hamm Building at the top of the list of potentially eligible Seattle landmarks in The Junction.

No buildings in the West Seattle

Junction are designated as Seattle landmarks. The Campbell Building and Hamm Building would be the first.
