

### Lou Whittaker - Class of 1947 Mountaineer

Some of the world's best mountaineers are from the Pacific Northwest. Sitting at the top, as they usually do on the summits, are West Seattle Alumni Ed Beckey, Jim Whittaker and Lou Whittaker. Ed Beckey and Jim Whittaker are esteemed members of our West Seattle High School's Hall of Fame.

Lou was a climber extraordinaire here in the Pacific and around the world. He is a member of the "First Family of American Climbing". Lou scaled the summit of 14,411 foot Mt. Rainier 250 times. Lou had been an inspiration

### **Madeline Smith Fraley - Class of 1962** *Medical Pioneer*

Madeline was a pioneer in modern medicine in Washington State. She helped to lead the way to greater access to more affordable health care via Physician Assistants (PAs). Madeline was one of the first Physician Assistants to practice in Washington State. Washington State officials say there were 3,431 Physician Assistants practicing in Washington State in 2016. Nationally, there are over 108,700 practicing PAs.

Madeline joined the world renowned Dr. Lester Sauvage's Cardiovascular team at Providence Medical Center, Seattle, in July 1975. She apparently was the first Physician Assistant (PA)

### Come Be a Part of West Seattle History!

The year was 1907. West Seattle, as well as 5 other growing neighborhoods of our City, were annexed to become part of Seattle. West Seattle has an abundance of prime view lots and homes. People were moving to Seattle and West Seattle in droves. West Seattle High School opened in 1902 at its original location at the corner of California SW and SW Lander Street. The original school was a big castle-like brick building which is the current site of Lafayette Elementary school. The 1907 real estate market in West Seattle was called unprecedented as our population exploded. Due to the growth spurt the old school building was getting cramped within a few years. West Seattle needed a separate high school. A half dozen years later, in 1917 our current West Seattle High School building, which we commemorate today, was finished, dedicated, and opened.

Come and be a part of West Seattle history! On June 3rd we will be celebrating the 100th Year Anniversary of the current building with a big event planned for this year's All School Reunion.

This year our Alumni Association has joined with the Southwest Historical Society to commemorate the 100th Year milestone. In addition to our fun at this year's All School Reunion we will have a special Group Hug photo taken outside of the Historical North entrance. The SW Historical Society's director, Clay Eals, has already undertaken Group Hug photos (GHP) at the Totem Pole on 60th Ave SW just off of Alki outside of their Log Cabin museum. Another GHP was taken outside of the Admiral Theater. These photos are now part of West Seattle's History.

Don't miss out on it! Your friends and former classmates will be there waiting for you. Our WSHS Alumni Association, including our Annual All School Reunion, is the glue which holds us together in a community. Our Alumni Association is considered one of the largest if not THE largest in the nation.

for more than a couple of generations of mountain climbers. He has guided more climbers to the summit of Mt. Rainier than anyone else.

Lou Whittaker has conquered many of the world's highest peaks. He was the first American to lead the ascent of the North wall of Mount Everest in 1984. The North wall, according to Wikipedia, refers to the "sharp-edged pass carved by glaciers in the ridge connecting Mount Everest and Changtse in Tibet" making it to the 29,028 foot summit.

In 1969 Lou partnered with Jerry Lynch and founded Rainier Mountaineering Inc. (RMI) which helped teach mountain guiding. This provides climbers not only with experienced guides, but guides who teach the climbers and encourage their success.

Lou loved the mountains and transformed this love into the sport of climbing. He has led expeditions to Mount Everest and Kanagchenjunga, and climbed high on K2.

At age 79 Lou stopped climbing due to painful knees. Several years later he received 2 new knees and was back hiking and skiing.

He is a world-renowned mountain guide and author. Lou is an icon among climbers the world over.

in cardiovascular surgery in the State of Washington.

In those early years there were many challenges as the medical community diligently struggled to understand the scope of practice of this new "mid-level" practitioner - the Physician Assistant. Physician Assistants perform many of the same services as an MD, under the supervision of their supervising MD. Madeline served on various committees helping to educate and bring understanding regarding the PA profession. She assisted in making decisions regarding the role of PAs in the state as well as outlining rules and regulations regarding credentialing and oversight. Even though the University of Washington had the MEDEX program, the Washington State Medical Association was challenged by having this new breed of mid-level health care provider in their midst.

Madeline's career was primarily that of managing and caring for cardiovascular surgical patients from diagnosis, to hospital admittance, to discharge; providing emergency treatment, maintaining continuity of care, assisting in surgery, supporting and collaborating with physicians and nursing staff, and comforting patients and families during extremely challenging times. Working long hours, she devoted her life-career to the patients; diagnosing, treating, holding hands and praying with patients and families - a career of expertise and passion.

Madeline loved her work. Maybe she was the first cardiovascular PA in the state, but certainly not the last. She taught at the PA and Nurse Practitioner program at the University of Washington. In addition, she was a mentor to pre-med students through the Heart Center Scholarship Program at the Providence Medical Center.

Because of Madeline's exemplary career many PAs have joined the ranks in the healthcare field.. For further information go to the website: Wshsaa.org/halloffame/inductees.



### NEW WEST SEATTLE HIGH SCHOOL OPENING OF WEST SEATTLE HIGH.



The structural contracts amounted to \$196,000, and the supplementary con-tracts for heating, plumbing, lighting, etc., brought the total cost up to \$281,000.





Unlike his past albums, this recording explored avant-garde free improvisation sound collages featuring several important jazz musicians including guitarist Bill Frisell, trumpeter Cuong Vu, trombonist Stuart Dempster, and clarinetist Bill Smith.

Here's her contribution: "With all that is pulling people apart in this world, it is heartening to learn of programs bringing people together. I spent five months in Tangier, Morocco with twenty-three U.S. college students as part of a study abroad program through the University of New England, where I'm a coordinator of global education.

It was wonderful to see the change in students over the course of the program. At first timid and uneasy in a place which seemed so foreign, they soon learned to embrace the challenge of bridging cultures, religions and languages. They shared meals with gracious Moroccan hosts, visited museums of history, art and culture, hiked with their jovial guide, Mohammed, along Mediterranean coastlines, learned the art of bartering for trinkets, navigated the narrow cobble-stone alleyways of the ancient Medina, and volunteered in local schools and an orphanage. Their time in Tangier taught them that people, no matter their citizenship, religion, or ethnicity were more alike than different, and that seeing oneself through the lens of another culture is the only way to truly understand oneself.

As an interesting aside, before leaving Tangier, I shared my newfound love of Morocco with fellow Class of '74 graduate, Janet Tillotson Patterson and her husband, Michael, when they visited the city. There were rooftop meals, wine, bartering, Medina meandering, and mischief for sure!"

And in closing, here's a contribution from Norm Smith: "As I sit here thinking back at the class of 1974, I am reminded that being the most awesome class in the history of West Seattle High School is indeed an honor and yet carries with it a burden to do more. Over the years West Seattle has produced some of the finest men and women in the history of Seattle public schools. I won't get into names here but we have produced astronauts, actresses, actors, politicians, authors, and yes, even athletes. Those are proud accomplishments, to be sure. But let's take a step back into the days of our youth, shall we? create relationships with others, how to deal with success and, just as important, how to deal with failures. We reached out to others hoping they would reach back in some way. We learned that we all had our strengths and weaknesses. We developed coping mechanisms. We learned how to cheer, and yes, we learned how to cry.

It took me years to understand that the most important lesson we could ever learn was that in our world, our differences were our strengths and that if we take the time to understand the differences in each other, we can truly become a better us. In the last few years, due to social media, I have come to understand how little we really knew about those we shared a hallway, lunchroom and classroom with or how little they really knew about us. How the bright kid across the hall from us may have just lost a parent and every day was a struggle. How the clothes a person wore every day were all they could afford. How a classmate was struggling with their sexual identity. Or how our preconceived notions or opinions about others affected how we treated them. Maybe we were blinded by our own youth at the time, so caught up in our own struggles that we never took the time to reach out or understand. I know that it still surprises people when I tell them about a certain soccer player who they thought had lots of friends and had the world by the horns was actually painfully shy, lacked self-confidence beyond sports and struggled for years with learning disabilities and how to read.

One of the luxuries of getting older is finding forgiveness and understanding that we may not have had during school. But more so, I just love seeing or hearing from others who we went to school with. To hear their successes, their struggles, all about what they have done since we left the halls of West Seattle High, discuss who may or may not have released a greased pig at the class of 74' graduation ceremony. You know, all the important stuff! But most of all, I love to hear about what they are doing to change the world. Our high school, including the class of '74, has taken the time to change other's lives. Some have taken in grandchildren to raise, some taken in at-risk youth from their areas, some are coaching, and some are leading seminars on self-improvement. Some take kids or our military veterans fishing or donate trips so others can take them. Others have worked years to become successful business people who in turn donate money to organizations that helps others succeed. We have fellow classmates that are teachers, nurses, police officers, and firefighters (bless every one of you that chose those careers).

This is my point: Yes, West Seattle High School has had our actors, authors, athletes, and politicians, I am just as proud to say that we had you, as a fellow student. For you are the person who gives back, who looks at others and without regard for your own personal gain or fortune says, "Yes, I can make a difference in your life". Remember, years from now, when we are gone and others gather in our halls, no one will ever talk about the cool car you drove or the house you may have lived in. You, my friends will be remembered for the time you gave, the ear you lent, and the guidance you provided. Thank you for allowing me to change, for the ear you lent, and the support you gave.

In closing, I will say that in our school today, I see a bright light that shines like never before. It shines brighter each day thanks to the work of each student for the last 100 years. 100 years ago our light was just a candle but as we gathered together our light became a torch. In time we as a school grew and with that growth came change and so did our light. Today we shine with the smiles of proud West Seattle High students past and present. Be proud of where we came from and excited about where we are going.

And yes, Class of '74 still rules!"





### **Dorothea Mootafes**

Teacher

### Obituary originally published in the Seattle Times

Dorothea Alice Mootafes, our beloved friend and teacher, left us to be with the Lord on October 12, 2016. She was 88 years old. Dorothea was born



in St. Louis in 1928 to Irene and Phillip Mootafes, Greek immigrants from the Asia Minor island of Imbros.

An outstanding student, Dorothea began her secondary school years at St. Louis' Beaumont High School. In 1944, following the death of her father, she, her sister Angelica, and her mother moved to Seattle to be closer to relatives. Dorothea then attended Lincoln High School, where she was a member or the Senior Honor Society and graduated in June 1946.

She enrolled at the University of Washington, majored in Journalism, was active in the journalism society, and joined Phrateres, an

informal group of coeds who commuted to campus. She received a BA with honors in 1949.

Recruited by the Washington State Game Department, Dorothea edited the weekly, "Game Bulletin", and prepared the annual reports. In 1953 she went to work for the Kelsonian-Tribune, Kelso's main newspaper, where she reported local events, and edited "Talk of the Town", a section which included the women's page, and club and society news. When the paper folded in the summer of 1954, she returned to Seattle and to UW, earning a secondary education certificate.

Dorothea then began her life's work and real love-teaching language arts and journalism at West Seattle High School. Her students affectionately referred to her as "Miss Moo". For over thirty years she was the advisor for the "Chinook", the award winning school newspaper. Many of her students considered her the best teacher they ever had and, because of her encouragement and belief in them, went on to prominent careers in journalism and communications.

In 1961 she was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship and spent a year in Iannina, Greece teaching English at a primary teachers college. She then returned to West Seattle High, enrolled once more at UW in the summer quarters, and in 1964 earned an MA in Education.

Dorothea's life very much revolved around her faith and her heritage. She was one of the most committed parishioners at her beloved St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church. Working behind the scenes - never bringing attention to herself - Dorothea served as unofficial church historian, pioneer and promoter of the Greek Festival, and an energetic co-worker with the church's priests. She wrote many articles about the church for the Seattle Times and the PI, and authored, with Theodora Argue and others, "A History of St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church and her People", which chronicled the

on Seattle, Washington. Marian grew up in West Seattle, attended James Madison Middle School and graduated form WSHS in 1938. Soon after graduation she moved to San Francisco, California following a fellow WSHS Class of 1935 graduate, Willis (Bill) John Craft. They married in 1940 and lived in San Francisco where Willie, as he was known in high school, worked as a longshoreman active in the West Coast Labor movement. He enlisted in the Navy shortly after the start of WWII wanting to do his part in the war effort. With her husband in the Pacific, Marian moved back to West Seattle during the war and worked in the human resources office at Boeing supporting those workers who were building the B-17 Flying Fortress. She was there when production achieved 5 Grand – 5,000th B-17 made, emblazoned with Boeing employee signatures.

Bill returned to longshoring in San Francisco after the war but soon moved his family to the Peninsula, south of San Francisco, where he went into business with his brother James Gray Craft, another WSHS graduate, Class of 1932. Together they owned and operated 3 stores in Redwood City until their retirement; North Fair Oaks Variety and Hardware, Toy Town and Middlefield Supply.

Bill died in 1992 and Marian continued to live independently in their family home where she died suddenly shortly before her 97th birthday.

In later years Marian enjoyed gardening, reading, knitting and keeping in touch with Seattle friends and family. She was a lifelong Democrat and enjoyed following politics ... always supporting causes that helped people in need.

# Fauntleroy Grade School Centennial

On May 21, 2017 Fauntleroy School celebrates its centennial

*Come and join the fun!* 

A 'Group Hug Photo" on Sunday May 21 at 11:30 am will "kick start" our celebration. Sponsored by the SW Historical Society, our Group Hug Photo will be a historic record of our celebration.

While all are gathered in front of the school, a new flagpole donated by alumni of the Gamrath Family will be unveiled and the flag raised. Kristy Grainger, Board President of Fauntleroy Community Service Agency will welcome everyone. Once inside the auditorium, alumnus Jane Hastings will introduce two special guests, alumnus Robert "Bob" Skotheim, son of former Principal and alumnus Jim Whittaker. I'm sure Jim will recall some school activities and other "shenanigans". All three are members of the WS Hall of Fame; Jane (1989) Class of 1945, Bob (1986) Class of 1951, and Jim (1986) Class of 1947. Very impressive!

There will be live music and several fun things for the children. Light snacks, "School Bites" will be available. Touring the building, reminiscing over class photos and memorabilia, and reconnecting with friends will carry us to the afternoon closing of 3 pm.

A Little Grade School History: The Fauntleroy Grade School has a special history. It was not always a Seattle Public School (closed in 1981) but has always been a School house for the benefit of children.

John F., Adams, a realtor and friend of Fauntleroy, provided his house as the site for the first school, grades one to four. A storeroom in Adams' house served well from 1906 to 1911 when fire destroyed it. Two portables were then built just East across 46th Avenue. The children came from these surrounding districts: Endolyne, Arbor Heights, Forest Hills, the west side of 35th Avenue and along the beach of Lincoln Park. Beyond the fourth grade the children went to Gatewood School.

Fauntleroy Grade School was constructed in 1917-1918 for the first through fourth grades, on land sold to the school district by John F. Adams. Because of rising attendance, it was expanded in 1949 and again in 1952. At one time it held classes K through 8th grade. In June 1981, with declining student enrollment, the Seattle School District closed fourteen elementary schools, including Fauntleroy. The school buildings and playground area stood unoccupied until October 1981 when the Fauntleroy Community Service Agency (FCSA) the non-profit organization founded by Dr. John By Bonnie Rochester Beerman, Class of 1946



Fauntleroy School, at 9131 California Ave. SW was built in 1917-18 and expanded in 1949 and 1952. In 1981, the school was closed. The Building is now used by the Fauntleroy Community Service Agency. Within the school is a day care with 115 children, a dance studio, a YMCS gymnasium, an artist's studio where classes are taught, a catering company and several other businesses. (Jack) Pierce in 1977, entered a master tenant lease with the Seattle School District. FCSA's first project, the Fauntleroy Children's Center occupied two classrooms in the school beginning October 19, 1981. The Fauntleroy Children's Center continued to grow to the present. The school in 2010 was eventually purchased by the Fauntleroy Community Service Agency, continuing the legacy "always a schoolhouse for the benefit of children".
