##### **Concert Pianist / Radio Personality**

Lisa Bergman graduated cum laude from the University of Washington and went on to obtain Masters' degrees in music from both State University of New York, Stonybrook and Julliard.

She made her recital debut at Carnegie Hall in 1983. She has performed throughout the U.S., Canada, Europe and Asia, averaging more than 60 engagements per year. She was selected by the U.S. Information Agency to represent the US on a performance tour of New Zealand, Nepal, Mongolia, China, Korea and Taipei. She also appeared

(He was team captain at West Seattle). He began his career with the Xerox Corporation in Seattle, where he eventually worked up to Regional General Manager.

If he still lived in Seattle, I believe his name would be familiar to many of our residents, but career opportunities instead took him to Southern California. He left Xerox in 1984, to build up a struggling company, and then help in it's sale. He repeated

With dear old (really old) West Seattle High School entering its second hundred years, it gives us all the chance to reflect on the past and look forward to the future. At the All-School Reunion (ASR) last June, alumni, students, faculty and staff gathered together for the Group Hug photo (see page 5) in front of the building so important to all of us. In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, public buildings were intentionally designed and built to reflect their importance to the com-

munity. It was for this reason that government buildings, courthouses, schools and libraries built during that time are imposing and beautiful. West Seattle High School’s physical appearance is certainly indicative of its importance to the community!

For this issue of the Alumni Chinook, I once again ‘raided’ the Alumni room archives for interesting tidbits to share. Since the 2017 Alumni Chinook concentrated on the 1917-1918 school year, I started with 1928 and took a Kimtah from each decade, looking at how student life changed or remained the same.

The evolution of athletics was particularly interesting: how football, boys’ basketball and baseball were consistent throughout, some sports, such as golf, tennis and cross-country evolved into co-ed teams. During the nineteen teens, twenties and thirties, girls had numerous sports teams that were popular. Interest appeared to taper off during the forties and fifties. The sixties saw a reprise in participation, but, not surprisingly, the advent of Title IX in 1972 brought about a true Renaissance in girls’ athletics. The Girl’s W Club for athletes was formed in 1928, with future film star and WSHS Hall of Famer Frances Farmer a very active participant. Please enjoy and reminisce!

This year saw some changes to the Alumni Board; Mary Rose Toal retired as Secretary and will be much missed. Stephanie Cole Aird moved from At-Large VP to Secretary and Diane Begunoff Venti accepted the At-Large position. Thank you to these and all the other Board members, class reps and others who keep this organization going, we couldn’t do this without you!

Hoping to see another big turnout on June 2nd!

as guest artist in 1997, 1999, and 2001 International Cello Festival in Japan. She has released 6 CDs of her performances. Lisa was the official accompanist for the Metropolitan Regional Opera Auditions and for the International Clarinet Society.

Lisa has also served as Artistic Director of the NW Opera, Icicle Creek Music Center, NW Opera in Schools, Etcetera (“NOISE”), the Mostly Nordic Chamber Music Series, and the Methow Valley Chamber Music Festival.

Lisa served as Artist in Residence of the UW music faculty from 1989 to 1999, teaching opera coaching and accompaniment. She is a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music, gives lectures and workshops. She is also a member of the Hall of Fame for the Washington State Music Teachers Association for her “extraordinary service, outstanding musicianship, dedication and leadership, which has significantly contributed to the development and growth of music education in the State of Washington.”

Currently Lisa is an on-air personality at KING FM radio where, among other features, she hosts the Exploring Music series. In 2013, she won a Gracie Award for her work as writer and host of Exploring Music, a program designed to introduce all ages, particularly children to the “fascinating and unusual stories behind classical music.”

that with another company. In 1993 he joined Emulex Corporation as Chief Executive Officer, serving for the next 13 years, followed by five years as Executive Chairman. By then he had earned a reputation as a business leader and a strategic thinker.

A leader in the technology industry, he serves on the boards of numerous Southern California companies. Orange County, in particular, has honored him in numerous ways. In 2000 he was named the Orange County Entrepreneur of the Year, in 2001, the Director of the Year and in 2006 The Philanthropist of the Year. By 2013 he was recognized as one of the top 50 most influential business leaders in Orange County.

Paul’s family moved to West Seattle when he was entering the 4th grade. He was not born with that proverbial “silver spoon” in his mouth (guaranteed success, so we are told). He came instead from the Central area housing projects. His parents worked long hours to support him and his brothers. At the West Seattle Boys Club, he encountered mentors and coaches that he credits as being major forces in the shaping of the man he has become. Throughout his life he said there have been people who helped show him a path to success. What he failed to mention was his ability and willingness to listen, learn, evaluate, and act on the advice and wisdom!

What I believe is remarkable about Paul is that he has generously chosen to use the means and influence he has achieved to “pay it forward”, having personally donated over 20 million dollars to charities in his area, most of which are projects for children and young people. The list includes Orange County Performing Arts Center, South Coast Repertory, Chapman University, the Mind Institute, Project Tomorrow, and Cal State Fullerton’s College of Business and Economics. He serves on the Board of Directors of most (all?) of these organizations, helping them have on-going success in fund-raising. He has two simple rules: No. 1 - Show you care by putting your own money into the pot. No. 2 - Be passionate about a cause. He clearly follows his own rules!

Paul’s legacy includes having his name on the South Coast Rep Theater and the Main Street to Cal State University named Folino Drive in his honor.

Hello from the WSHS Foundation! This year has been a quiet year for us. Brick sales continue, we have some restricted funds we are looking to spend this year and we are here to support the needs of the staff and students at WSHS.

The Foundation started out years ago before the school was remodeled, before students moved back into the new building and before there was a PTSA to fundraise for the needs of the school. We produced the ‘Kick-Off’ for the Opening of the School and started exploring needs of the school and brainstormed as to how we could support the school for those long-term items that were needed.

Since the inception of the Foundation, these are some of our accomplishments:

- Production of the School Dedication, September 2002.
- Secured larger trees and bricks for the courtyard.
- Purchased library books that were much needed to fill the shelves.
- Purchased the multi-media projector for the Performing Arts Center.
- Started the school’s first Auction and continued for several years as the PTSA built their membership and was able to take over the event.

# WSHS ALUMNI COMMUNICATIONS UPDATE

Greetings from your Communications VP:

On a rare bluebird day at Snoqualmie Pass, though where the snow level was more reminiscent of late March than early February, my husband Wayne and I slid onto a chair lift at Summit East (formerly Hyak). On the chair ride, our conversation turned to the chat we'd just had with a family friend who had shared the shuttle ride from our mutual ski lodge. He is currently a junior in high school, and said his favorite class in school is history. I responded that while I hadn't been particularly inspired about history when studying it in high school, my newfound and poignant mantra – 'learn from your history or repeat it', has taken on a more urgent dynamic given today's political climate. On hearing this, our co-rider on the chair lift, a vibrant snow-boarder, piped up to say he himself was a high school teacher of history. It came about that he, Lou Jurcik, is in his second year of teaching at West Seattle High. Intrigued, I asked him of his relatively early impressions of our alma mater. He responded, 'It was like going back to the 1950's – in a good way. So many of my students show up at school with a vast family history of fellow school alumni behind them – parents, aunts, uncles, grandparents, cousins.' He marveled over the unusually deeply interconnected community roots and shared history of students at West Seattle High.

A couple days later I listened to guest speaker Jeffrey Stein, Director of Product and Partnerships for Future First USA, talk about this non-profit that manages an online service called the Alumni Toolkit. Their mission is to help public high schools build vibrant alumni communities, to provide every student with the inspiration, support and resources they need to succeed. This is a free service, dedicated to enabling teachers, counselors and other staff leverage the rich resource of alumni by matching experience and background to opportunities within the classroom and school. Counselors are critical subject matter experts to high school students. Some 70-80% of students parents did not take the college path, and are less able to guide their kids through the obstacle course to obtain college scholarships, and afford and succeed in related studies. The current ratio of counselor to student at our school is something like 480:1, so any extra help with college and career planning is a major support to our current students. **Learn more about how you can plug in by visiting, and registering at [www.alumnitoolkit.org](http://www.alumnitoolkit.org).**

The next day, while sharing this information with my sister during our weekday morning commuting phone call, she recounted how she had entered the study of Occupational Therapy right out of West Seattle High School, largely due to one of the Career Counselors. During a time my sister was moving forward from the untimely loss of our mom, this counselor made time for her, encouraged her in her fledgling career interest, and introduced her to a peer in the field, who became an ongoing professional mentor and advocate as she made her way through the early stages of college and career planning and execution. Today she has been

beautifully positioned to practice her skilled service in that field while raising her family and in time, moving forward into her later years. To me, this is the essence of our Westside High community and extended family. It is giving back to those coming up behind us to assure they thrive in their career and life choices. For me, my alumni connection is sharing a history of coming of age with my alumni parents (they graduated a year apart, informally engaged on their first date, married within a year), all of their siblings – my aunts and uncles, most of my cousins, my own sister and brother, my daughters who love our shared school, and my Seattle-based nieces. For me, it is partnering on a social service/non-profit project with my mom's best friend from high school who today is my own close neighbor and friend. It is my daughters' discovery that their recent Uber driver graduated with their uncle, and staying in touch with my high school friends' parents throughout their lives, and my Dad and his best friend from high school, whose daughters enjoy a cherished, life-long friendship, who meet up at the all-school reunions.

All of this is business as usual at Westside High. Connection and community- it is our legacy; our past, present and future. We celebrate this by turning back to lend a supporting hand, encouragement, connection and mentorship to those following in our footsteps at our alma mater. In returning to the place of our roots to share and to give back. Our gift and opportunity is to be available within our alumni community; to give back to those following in our footsteps.

**Scholarships awarded at the 2017 All School Reunion**

Each January the Scholarship process begins all over again. We update forms to make sure all pertinent information is requested from the applicant. We review current SAT/ACT updates, the State of WA College Bound program parameters, tuition and fee structures, make our reservation at the school to conduct interviews, speak with the senior counselor, speak to the PTSA, etc., etc., all before our first interview in April.

We do our best to help, based on merit and financial needs, as many students as possible begin the college phase of their education with Tuition assistance. As in the past, the WSHSAA was presented with another wonderful mix of scholars with well-rounded resumes.

This year, we were able to award 13 new scholarships to students in the Class of 2017 as well as 5 returning students. Our total scholarship awards were \$137,400 for the 2017-2018 school year.

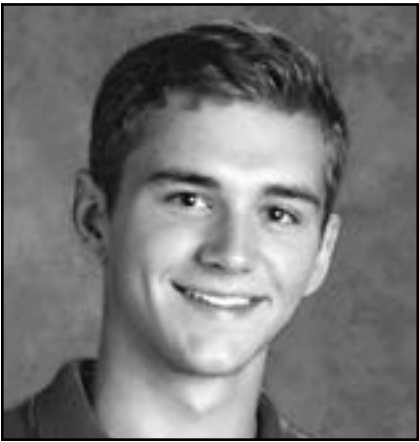

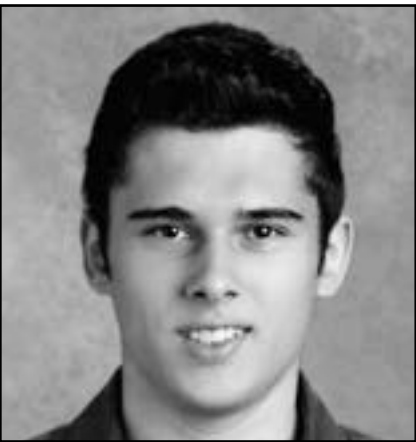

SEATTLE SCHOOL DISTRICT INITIATES ATHLETE HALL OF FAME

The Seattle Public School District (SPD) has created their own Hall of Fame for student athletes, coaches and "staff and/or supporters".

To be eligible as an individual student athlete, the following are required:

- 1. At least 10 years have passed since the candidate's year of graduation.
- 2. Candidate lettered in at least 1 sport twice or 2 sports at least once dur-ing their high school career.
- 3. Candidate exemplified sportsmanship, leadership, citizenship and team-work as a high school athlete.
- 4. Candidate was selected as an All-City, All-State performer, State Champion, All-American National Champion OR has made a significant athletic contribution to high school, college or professional athletic competi-tion.

To be eligible as a Team, no more than 1 team of athletes is eligible for nomi-nation if the team, in one particular season and sport:

- 1. Won a State Championship, National Championship or made a signifi-cant contribution at any level of athletic competition.
- 2. At least 5 years have passed since such season.
- 3. Team achieved significant accomplishments raising the bar or set a stan-dard for future teams to follow
- 4. The team left a "notable legacy" on SPD Athletics.

To be eligible as a Coach (or staff/supporter), no more that one individual coach, staff member or supporter of SPD is eligible IF:

- 1. More than 5 years have passed since candidate's service to SPD Athletics.
- 2. Candidate made significant contribution to SPD Athletics through their leadership, inspiration and support.
- 3. Candidate's accomplishments raised or set a standard for future coaches, teams, administrators and supporters of SPD Athletics.

Currently, the only inductee from West Seattle High School is Jim Whittaker.

CHALLENGE: In WSHS's 100+ year history, there must be a number of students, teams and coaches that meet this criteria. Let's get busy and find some candidates to nominate!

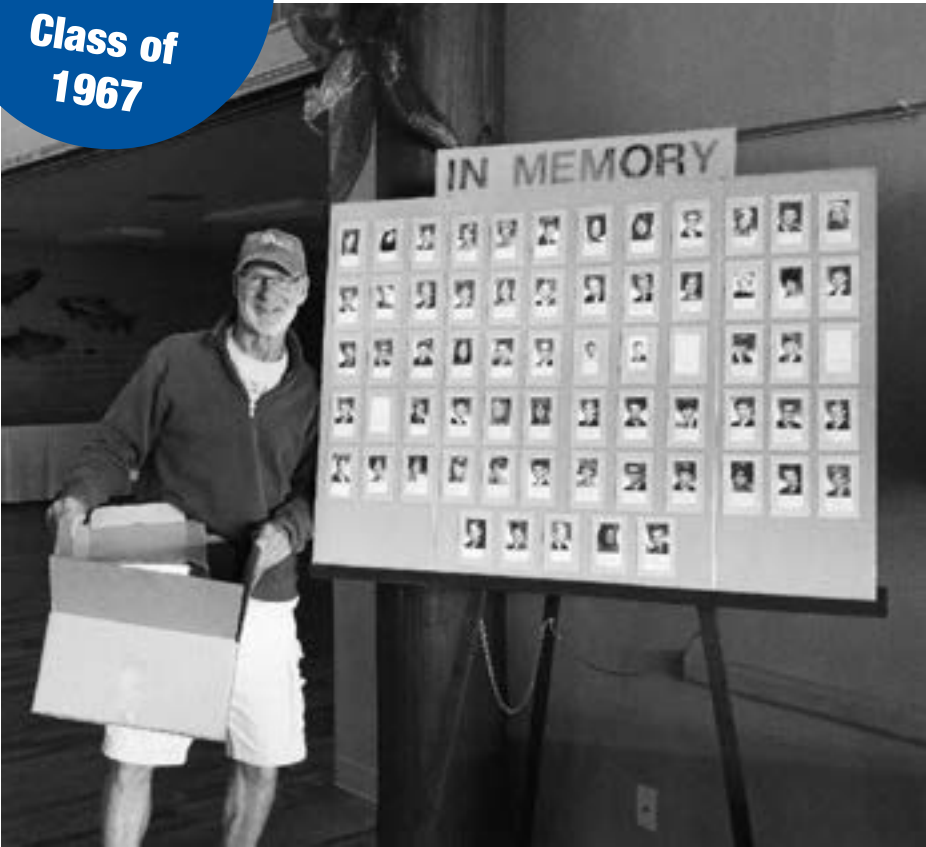

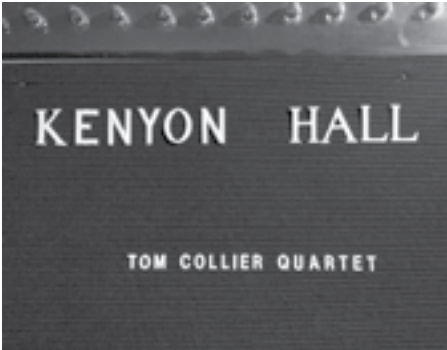

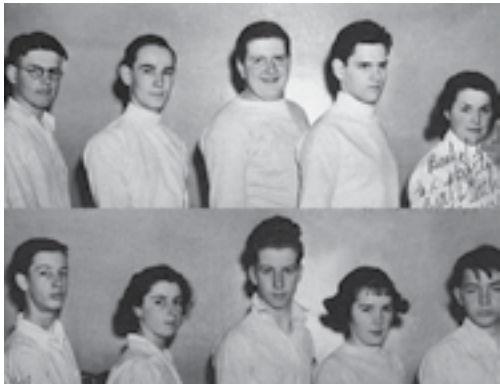

Fred Beckey

HALL OF FAMER, Class of 1941

Mountain climbing legend Fred Beckey, long recognized as the all-time world record holder for the number of first ascents credited to one man, passed away October 30, 2017 at the age of 94.

Fred wrote extensively about mountaineering, drawing both from personal experiences as well as study of historical documents to produce a series of Cascade climbing guides, known as “Beckey’s Bibles”. He taught and inspired generations of climbers. Fred made climbing history in several ways: at age 15, he was among the first to summit Mt. Despair, at 19, he ascended Mt. Waddington, the highest peak in British Columbia’s coast range. Alaska’s Mt. George Nokes Jr., a Seattle fastpitch softball star when the sport was in its heyday locally, died at age 76 in Mesa, Arizona, on April 26. Nokes is best known as the first baseman for Pay ‘n Pak and Peterbilt. He was on the 1980 Peterbilt team that won the national championship. He drove in the winning run in a 1-0 victory over Bay City, Michigan, that put Peterbilt into the semifinals. In a 1971 article in The Seattle Times, Pay ‘n Pak Manager Bill Fenton said, “You can quote me as saying George probably is the finest defensive player I’ve ever coached.” Nokes also hit .421 that season. Nokes was a graduate of West Seattle High School where he starred in baseball.

WSHS Alum, Class of 1954, Turbaned as a Nigerian Chief

Dr. Ron Rice, Class of 1954, was turbaned as a Nigerian Chief, honored for his work providing wheelchairs for Nigerian polio survivors. Rice may be the first white man in all of Nigeria so honored; if not the first, then one of very few.

There is more polio in Nigeria than anywhere in the world. Tens of thousands of children and adults spend their lives crawling on the ground. Rotary International, the Gates Foundation and others are spending billions to eradicate polio. In fact the last 3 cases in Nigeria were in August 2016. The bad news is that very little is being done for the survivors. Rice and his Nigerian partner, Ayuba Gufwan, who walks on his hands from polio, have a shop in Jos, Nigeria with 65 employees where they build a self-pedaled tricycle made of bicycle parts. So far they have built and donated over 16,000 wheelchairs, far, far more than anyone else is doing for polio survivors in all of Nigeria.

16,000 wheelchairs have just scratched the surface. Most of these polio survivors are hidden away. If you couldn't get any further from your house than you could crawl on your hands and knees, you wouldn't be out in public very often. A \$150 wheelchair transforms that person's life! Rice has also given out thousands of folding white canes to blind students, and provides food, electricity and computers and other help for 430 deaf students at a desperately poor boarding school for the deaf.

Rice has a 501c3 nonprofit called Wheelchairs for Nigeria and seeks to raise \$15,000 every month to fund this program. He receives no salary. Watch the 5 minute video on his website, [www.WheelchairforNigeria.org](http://www.WheelchairforNigeria.org) to get an overview of the project.

In September, Rice made his 25th trip to Nigeria, where he and his partner Ayuba did 9 large wheelchair presentations in 6 different states, each involving 6-10 hours of driving on very dangerous roads, and gave out over 500 wheelchairs in 3 weeks.

His main responsibility in his retirement is raising money for these wheelchairs which cost \$150 each. He has to raise \$15,000 a month to keep the shop in full production. So far he has raised \$1.5 million. Thousands of kids, who otherwise sit at home, unable to crawl long distances to school, are now in school because they now have mobility. Thousands of adults who could never get further from their

home than they could crawl, now can find a job, go to the market, to church or to the mosque, because they have mobility. However at almost every wheelchair presentation, far more people show up whose names are not on the list, hoping to get a wheelchair. So the need remains huge.

In one of the September presentations, a member of Nigeria's House of Representatives (similar to the US Congress) organized a distribution of 70 wheelchairs in his city. He said "No one has ever done anything like this for the disabled of Bauchi." The Chief Imam of the Central Mosque said, "These people have come from a faraway country and they are not even Muslims, but their religion has taught them to have mercy and compassion on needy ones." The President of the Handicapped Association lamented the neglect of the disabled and challenged the people to emulate the white man who came all the way from America to care for the handicapped.



A Biography of Ron Rice, Class of '54

Have you noticed just how many extraordinary lives have been written about in your Chinook throughout the years? Dr. Ron Rice, class of 1954, is another West Seattle graduate whose contributions have been quietly creating happier and more productive lives worldwide.

Rice is a retired Presbyterian pastor, having attended Lafayette, Madison, WSHS ('54), Whitworth University ('58), Princeton Theological Seminary ('61) and received his doctorate from San Francisco Seminary ('78). He has served pastorates at Bellevue Presbyterian, chaplain at Whitworth University, First Presbyterian of Centralia, WA and is back on the staff at West Side Presbyterian where he grew up and was ordained in 1962. He has also been a semi-professional photographer since college days, and now his videos are raising tens of thousands of dollars for wheelchairs. In October, Whitworth University honored Rice as Alumni of the Year.

Rice was a Boy Scout in Andy Nelson's Troop 282, and became the troop's first Eagle Scout. Scouting instilled a lifelong appreciation of camping, hiking and mountain climbing, including ascents of Mt. Rainier and other Pacific Northwest peaks. One of Rice's most memorable West Seattle High teachers was Mrs. Dorothy Smith, who broadened his focus to the world. He put himself through 7 years of school with photography, and met his wife Sharon while photographing a Whitworth wedding.

Upon graduation from Princeton in 1961, the newlyweds took a 9-month trip around the world on a shoestring, visiting 34 countries, including camping for 5 months throughout Europe, the Soviet Union and the Middle East. Love of travel has continued, so that in May 2017 they made a 12-country tour by bus and train through the Balkans and Eastern Europe, trying to get to 100 countries before old age caught up. The Ukraine was their 104th country. They have been happily married for 57 years, and have three grown children and 6 grandchildren.

### The Spirit of West Seattle

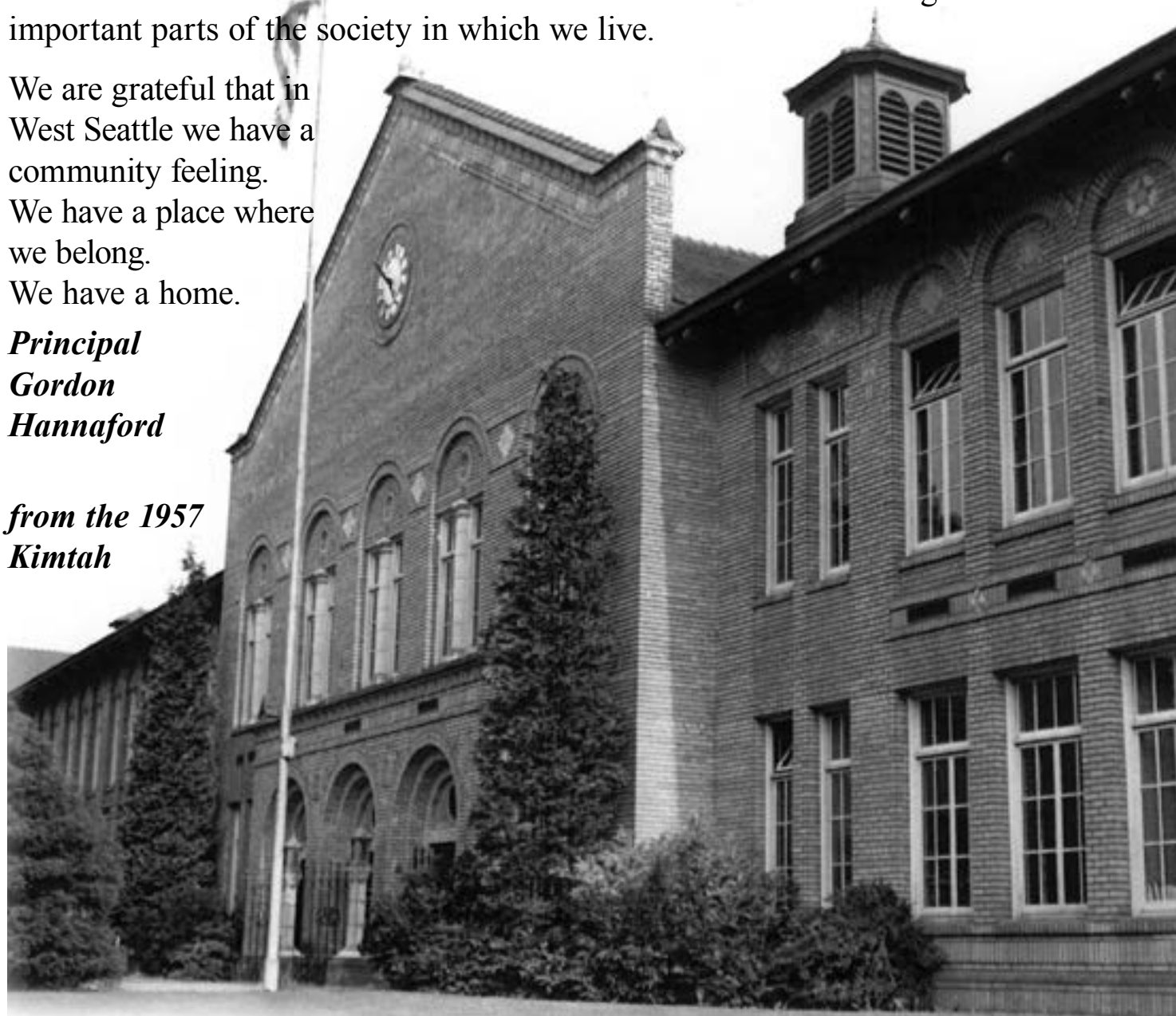
