Christine R. Charbonneau - Class of 1978 CEO, Planned Parenthood of the Great Northwest and the Hawaiian Islands

Chris has come a long way from the halls of WSHS, where she served as Kimtah editor. As CEO of Planned Parenthood of the Great Northwest and the Hawaiian Islands, Chris oversees 28 health centers in four states, a staff of more than 500 and manages budget of more than \$50M. In this, the largest geographic affiliate in the PP federation, medical services and sexual education services are provided to more than 100,000 men, women, and teenagers each year. In her 34 years with Planned Parenthood, starting as a volunteer while she attended the University of Washington, Chris has been at the forefront of providing health care services



Elizabeth Becker - Class of 1965 Wartime Reporter / Author / Journalist

Elizabeth Becker followed her graduation from West Seattle High School in 1965 by earning undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Washington, specializing in Southeast Asian Studies. In 1973, she traveled to Southeast Asia to start her career as a freelance reporter covering the war. To fairly be described as a pioneer, one needs to be among the first at something. Elizabeth Becker really is a pioneer among women war correspondents, being among the very first to cover the war in Southeast Asia, and at a time when there was very substantial resistance to women engaging in that role.

Elizabeth Becker is a nationally renowned author and journalist who began her career as a pioneering woman correspondent during the Vietnam War. She and a dozen other women permanently ended the


It's been another busy year for the WSHS Alumni Association, with questions being raised and, hopefully answered, about our past and future.

A gift of meticulously-kept scrapbooks came from Marilyn Peterson Graves, class of 1945. Marilyn's mother, Vera Copp Peterson, was a member of the first graduating class in 1910. Through Marilyn's collection, we learned that the WSHS Alumni Assoc, "...which had been inactive since early 1941", was revived in 1955 by some members of the class of 1930 while planning their 25th reunion."

The first Alumni scholarship of \$150.00 was awarded to Jerry Caton in 1957, raised by \$1.00 dues. It's pretty amazing that we have grown from that to the \$100,000.+ in scholarships the Alumni Association is able to give every year to our current graduates.

Presently, there are two vacancies on the Alumni Board: Stephanie Aird ('89) and Jim Biava ('71) stepped down from the positions of Secretary and Program VP, respectively. We thank them for their contributions and company and wish them all the best.

to women and families, harnessing technology to bring care to patients in some of the most remote parts of the country.

In 1986, the Planned Parenthood Federation of America recognized Chris's early skills in heading up a cancer-screening program at the Seattle PP clinic. They tapped her to open the very first PP affiliate in the State of Arkansas. Starting from the ground up, as Executive Director, she was responsible for all operations and for generating community support. She was awarded the honorary title of Arkansas Traveler (given to those who have contributed to the progress of the state) by then governor Bill Clinton.

Chris returned to Seattle in 1988. In 1993 she was named President and CEO of Planned Parenthood of Seattle King County, managing nine health centers. In 1996 she coordinated the merger of PPs of Seattle-King County, Snohomish County and of Pierce and the Coastal Counties to create PP of Western Washington, an organization of 400+ employees, 23 health centers, 25 educators and a proactive public affairs division. She also led a \$7M capital campaign to build a new HQ building. The PPFA continued to acknowledge her leadership and, in 2008, added Alaska, Hawaii, and Idaho to Chris's responsibilities. As of this writing, three mid-western states are on tap to join the mix.

Chris's unique ability to perceive future needs and challenges in her field led her to help found Afaxys Pharmaceuticals, an organization that works to secure affordable contraceptives for Planned Parenthood affiliates, health departments, and health organizations serving low-income women, ensuring that the organization maintains some control over the pricing and supply. Under her watch, PP began using Electronic Medical Records and testing telemedicine, allowing patients to seamlessly navigate the health center system and receive prompt, consistent care no matter their location—especially important in some of the outer regions of Alaska.

In 2014, Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) honored Chris with the Ruth Green Award. It is the highest honor that can be bestowed upon a CEO. It recognized Chris's outstanding achievements in planning, public affairs, and fundraising. It noted Chris's leadership is defined by her distinct ability to develop innovative ways to make PPGNW more accessible to patients, while at the same time maintaining stability within the organization. This balance makes her, according to then PPFA President Cecile Richards, "a true visionary among health care providers."

And in 2015, the proud Husky was named the Distinguished Alum of the University of Washington's Political Science Department.

ban that had prevented women from covering battles. She went to be among the first reporters to warn the world about the Khmer Rouge genocide and to interview major Khmer Rouge leaders, including Poi Pot himself. Her investigation of that genocide "When The War Was Over: Cambodia and the Khmer Rouge" the classic history. She was the only journalist asked to testify as an expert witness at the criminal tribunal of the Khmer Rouge. In May of last year, *Havre de Guerre*, (Jean Francois Bouvet, 2018), was published in France, telling the story of Elizabeth and her few female colleagues as pioneering female journalists in Southeast Asia. Elizabeth's picture graces the book cover, and in 2019, Bouvet's book will be made into a movie. https:/ iwww.fayard.fr/havre de-guerre-9782213709550.

During her 40 year journalism career she worked for the country's premiere news organizations, as Washington Post correspondent, National Public Radio's Senior Foreign Editor in charge of all foreign news and New York Times correspondent covering the Pentagon, National Security and International Economics. Among her awards and honors is the 2002 Pulitzer for public service awarded to the Times staff covering 9/11; an Amazon Book of Year for "Overbooked: The Exploding Business of Travel and Tourism; "two Columbia-DuPont awards for producing specials on the first democratic elections in South Africa and the genocide in Rwanda; and recognition by the Robert F Kennedy Book Awards for her Cambodia book.

During her forty years as a journalist, Elizabeth Becker worked at many of the top news organizations in America, writing thousands of articles and managing staffs of some of the most talented journalists in America and the world. At The New York Times from 1995 to 2005, Ms. Becker covered the Pentagon, homeland security, international economics, and agriculture. She was a member of The New York Times staff that won the Pulitzer Prize for Public Service for coverage of 9/11. As the Times International Economics correspondent, she reported on trade and globalization from Asia, Europe, Latin America and the United States. Her farm agricultural coverage won five awards from the North American Agricultural Journalists Association.

Prior to joining the Times, she was the Senior Foreign Editor at National Public Radio where she directed all foreign coverage for the network. She expanded coverage in Asia and Africa. She received two DuPont-Columbia Awards as executive producer for reporting of South Africa's first democratic elections and the Rwanda genocide. Later, as a journalist based in Paris (1986 to 1990), she covered the peace negotiations that culminated in the Cambodian Peace Accords of 1992.

Thomas M. Davis, the author of this nomination and a classmate of Elizabeth's, concludes: "The induction would broaden her platform for inspiration to the young people of West Seattle as an author, journalist, public speaker and news analyst. They might learn of one of their school's predecessor's many amazing accomplishments."



Scholarships awarded at the 2018 All School Reunion

Each year the six member scholarship committee has the honor of representing the Alumni by awarding scholarships to well deserving students. It's not a responsibility taken lightly.

This year was an amazing year. We were able to award 22 new scholarships to students in the Class of 2018 as well as 6 returning students. Our total scholarship awards were \$145,500 for the 2018- 2019 school year.





One very special guest was Mr. Richard Dyksterhuis, whose three-year term as Principal of West Seattle High School matched our years there.


The Alumni Association's list of emails and addresses, Facebook, and word of mouth helped us locate many of our






On February 15th, Tom played his vibes with The Silver-Tongued Devils at the West Seattle Eagles' annual Valentine Weekend dance.



West Seattle Monogram Club

Each year the West Seattle Monogram Club - established in 1965 - raises money to help graduating West Seattle student athletes (male or female) pursue higher education. To our knowledge, no other public high school in the country has a not-for-profit club made up of former school athletes dedicated to helping current student athletes pay for college.

Graduating varsity athletes are invited to apply for a Monogram Scholarship. Unlike most other scholarships, the candidates do not have to be at the top of the class academically. The Scholarship Committee looks for hardworking student athletes who need financial help to pursue a goal of higher education.

Specifically, applicants have to be graduating seniors, have a varsity letter or a varsity "Monogram" earned in competition, a 2.5 GPA, and have a thoughtful plan for his or her post-high school goal. The award is sent to the college or university to offset tuition.

The Club meets at 11:30am for lunch at the West Seattle Golf Club on the first Tuesday of October, December, February, and June. If you are a visitor to the Club, the lunch costs \$12.00 and you must make a reservation no later than five days before the meeting date. For a reservation contact Don Conner, treasurer at 206-660-0913 or Ted Foss, President at 206-932-5349. In August the Club has a luncheon at Salty's for members and partners and usually invites an important sports figure to be guest speaker. At regular meetings we catch up with former classmates, and teammates to share our former athletic experiences that seem to get more impressive with time, and hear from West Seattle coaches and students about the high school's sports program.

Two of the oldest members of the Monogram Club are Dick Barnecut and Jerry Costacos from the class of 1944. The club members all feel honored to have played varsity sports with them, and to share quality time with them at the Monogram Club meetings held four times a year at the West Seattle Golf Club House.





SEATTLE SCHOOL DISTRICT ATHLETE HALL OF FAME Nomination Requirements

The Seattle Public School District (SPD) has created their own Hall of Fame for student athletes, coaches and "staff and/or supporters".

To be eligible as an individual student athlete, the following are required:

- 1. At least 10 years have passed since the candidate's year of graduation.
- 2. Candidate lettered in at least 1 sport twice or 2 sports at least once during their high school career.
- 3. Candidate exemplified sportsmanship, leadership, citizenship and teamwork as a high school athlete.

4. Candidate was selected as an All-City, All-State performer, State Champion, All-American National Champion OR has made a significant athletic contribution to high school, college or professional athletic competition.

To be eligible as a Team, no more than 1 team of athletes is eligible for nomination if the team, in one particular season and sport:

- 1. Won a State Championship, National Championship or made a significant contribution at any level of athletic competition.
- 2. At least 5 years have passed since such season.
- 3. Team achieved significant accomplishments raising the bar or set a standard for future teams to follow
- 4. The team left a "notable legacy" on SPD Athletics.

To be eligible as a Coach (or staff/supporter), no more that one individual coach, staff member or supporter of SPD is eligible IF:

- 1. More than 5 years have passed since candidate's service to SPD Athletics.
- 2. Candidate made significant contribution to SPD Athletics through their leadership, inspiration and support.
- 3. Candidate's accomplishments raised or set a standard for future coaches, teams, administrators and supporters of SPD Athletics.

Currently, the only inductee from West Seattle High School is Jim Whittaker.

CHALLENGE: In WSHS's 100+ year history, there must be a number of students, teams and coaches that meet this criteria. Let's get busy and find some candidates to nominate!

Beverly Jean Hauptli, member of the West Seattle High School Class of 1973, passed away on February 24, 2018.

As a young girl, Bev initially set her sights on becoming an elementary school teacher, but once at West Seattle High School, beloved teacher Dorothy Mootafes lit a fire in Bev for journalism, a flame that never flickered. Bev eagerly wrote for the Chinook, the school newspaper, and enrolled at Washington State University to pursue her chosen field.




















Reunion Reminders

Is West Seattle High School Haunted?

A recent issue of the Seattle Annual Manual magazine had an article about some buildings in Seattle reputed to be haunted, one of which was West Seattle High School:

"Former student Rose Higginbotham, who hung herself at West Seattle High School in 1924, continues to haunt her alma mater. Higginbotham and several other students of the era have reportedly been seen and heard in the park adjacent to the high school on particularly foggy mornings."

This news item was mentioned at one of our Class Rep meetings last year and was not familiar to anyone in the room. Further investigation was encouraged.

Online searches to local sources revealed no firm answers. The Spooked in Seattle webpage acknowledged that "stories persist", but that "No records prove that a girl may have hung herself there in 1924..." Another website, Boo Seattle, states "Rumor has it that a student named Rose Higginbotham committed suicide inside of the school building in 1924, but no records have ever been found to confirm this..."

In researching further, 3 families named Higginbotham were found living in West Seattle during the 1920s; but none of them appeared to have included a girl named Rose. Our own Alumni database had no one named Rose Higginbotham showing as having ever attended WSHS. The Seattle School District archives found one teenaged girl, a member of one of the West Seattle Higginbotham families, but whose first name was not Rose, and who was attending Broadway High School, not West Seattle, in 1927, 3 years after Rose was supposed to have died.

Three separate searches of the King County Bureau of Vital Statistics, whose records for Seattle date back to 1907, found that no Death Certificate was ever issued for anyone named Rose Higginbotham in 1924.

Since no records (or photographs) of a Rose Higginbotham seem to exist, nor any record of a death at West Seattle High School in 1924, whatever phenomenon that has been seen over the years will remain in the realm of myth.
